

### Knowing Jesus and the Weakness of God

I remember waking up in the middle of the night in the Arizona dessert and looking up at the stars. I was too young to appreciate constellations, or even to recognize the Milky Way, but nevertheless I was transfixed at what I saw. I had never been so free from the light pollution of the city, and the air seemed so thin. As if I could literally reach out and touch the sea of stars.

Whenever I think of God, that Arizona epiphany comes to mind. God is over and above the vastness of the stars and even the universe. God is awesome beyond imagining.


But what is truly awesome, or awe-inspiring, is that this 'almighty' God chooses, for whatever reason, to be known in **weakness**. The fancy word for that is *kenosis*, which means "emptying". God opts to empty God's own self, presumably for the reason of not overwhelming us, and revealing to us something we otherwise wouldn't know about God. *God's only de-*

sire is to give Godself away, that we may grow to be like God.

The self-emptying love of God reaches its fullness in the person of Jesus. Which is why this Lenten season we will focus on him who is for us the model, or "the blueprint" as Richard Rohr says, of God's life for us. In our upcoming retreat, in our Wednesday vespers, in a book study, and in our Holy Week and Easter celebrations, we will explore this Jesus who continues to divinely astound us with his humanness. And who, in virtue of that emptying, leads us to a deeper life in God.

Please join us this Lent as we walk in the footsteps of Jesus towards the life God intends for us.

### **Annual Meeting in a Minute**

Follows is a shortened synopsis of the Treasuer's report, Old Business, New Business and President's Report from the official St Paul Lutheran Church Annual Meeting minutes of January 22, 2017.

TREASURER'S REPORT Wayne Martens reviewed the balance sheet. Checking balance as of Dec 31, 2016 was \$22,747.35. It was suggested by Dan Nielsen that the congregation be provided a comparison report showing 3-5 years. It was announced that the church's bookkeeping is now in-house with our secretary, Meisha Sible, keeping the books. Lowell Miller reviewed the 2017 budget.

OLD BUSINESS 1. Capital Campaign: Wayne Martens presented the recommendation for St Paul to use ELCA Mission Investment Fund to lead our Capital Campaign to raise funds to reduce the current mortgage. 2. Sign Ad-Hoc Committee discussion was tabled.

NEW BUSINESS 1. Leon Schwartz explained the changes to the church Constitution and By-laws. The council had previously set quorum to be 7% of church membership. Dan Nielsen moved to change the quorum to 25 members, this was seconded and passed. Trust Fund Committee By-law changes were also accepted. 2. Karl

Korte presented the Nominating Committee Report: Alyssa Tadlock and Daniel Cross were appointed to the Church Council. Tucker Baker & Pat Nelson were elected to the Church Council. Barb Kellogg was elected to the Trust Fund Committee. Jim & Pat Nelson were elected to represent St Paul at the Synod Assembly. John Sneller & Julie Feirer were elected to the Nominating Committee. 3 more people are needed for this committee. Wayne Martens & Terri Stolte were appointed to SPRC. Marilyn Mount & Camma Stott were nominated and will be presented to the Church Council for election.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT Pat Nelson reported that the Council approved the Furniture Ministry as a sanctioned Ministry of St Paul. The Furniture Ministry can now issue a charitable tax receipt for the furniture and household items donated.

Due to limited time, no further verbal reports were given - everyone was encouraged to review the written reports, which can now be found on the St Paul website.
